Year 4 have settled back into work and are looking forward to learning about Africa and Dabaso this term.

PE

For this term, we shall be having PE on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Please ensure that the children have a named PE kit in school. The children will need their trainers in everyday as we shall be continuing with our mile-a-day.

Homework

The children are expected to be practising their spellings, reading and using TTRockstars on a daily basis. By the end of year 4, the children are expected to know all their times tables to 12x12 and their corresponding division facts. E.g. $56 \div 7 = 8$. Timetables are an important skill to master so please help your child practise.

Homework and reading logs will be given out on **Fridays** and they shall be collected each **Wednesday**. Please see the homework time table to see the homework that has been set for that week. Reading log activities are to be completed each week. The homework will either be an activity from the "10 things to do" list or it will be a set piece of Maths or PSHME. The timetable for this is stuck in their red homework books. If homework is not completed, children will be staying in on Friday break to complete.

Reading Logs

If children have completed the list of activities, then they can restart the list and complete the activity again with a different book.

A reading log activity needs to be completed once a week. The list of activities will be stuck on the front page of their reading logs. The children will have completed an activity in school to show the children of the expectations when completing these activities. Children are to use pencil in their books and they have to complete it to a high standard. If the work is not to their high standard, they may be asked to complete it again. The children are aware of how they should be presenting their homework and the amount of effort that we expect them to put into their homework.

Home-school Link Books

We are continuing to use the back of the reading log books as a form of communication. This will be checked on a **Wednesday** when they hand their books in. If you have a question for me, please feel free to write this in the back of their book and I will reply.
